Anglo Saxons– Don't Let The Bed Bugs Bite

Venue: Stockwood Discovery Centre (75 minutes)

Session summary:

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The session begins with a 'beauty pageant' of bugs that irritated the Anglo-Saxons as much as they bother people today and a discussion of how we deal with them. The pupils then explore how the Anglo-Saxons coped without modern methods. The class performs an Anglo -Saxon ritual used whilst cutting medicinal herbs and then work in groups of 2-3 to make a simple herbal remedy for head lice. They next consider the role of faith in pre-Christian Anglo-Saxon medicine and the children make a simple amulet to take home. The plenary compares the understanding of the Anglo-Saxons to our own.



Learning objectives:

Pupils should be able to:

- Describe some of the pests and diseases people suffered with during the Anglo Saxon period
- Compare how our understanding of how to treat such pests differs with those in the Anglo Saxon period
- Consider the importance of religion in the understanding of illness and medicine
- Make an Anglo Saxon remedy for lice

Learning outcomes:

At the end of this session children will be able to recall some of the pests and diseases that affected our ancestors. They will be aware that they did not have doctors in the same way that we did, but that some of their cures may still have worked. They will know that in the past religion played an important part in the understanding of illness.
