



## Session summary:

This session uses the story 'Mrs Armitage on Wheels' by Quentin Blake to encourage the children to explore the gallery to find different examples of wheels and consider the reasons for their different designs. They compare wheels by selecting the biggest and smallest they can find on display and use standard and non-standard units of measurement to find their height.

## Learning objectives:

The pupils will have the opportunity to:

- Use observation skills to compare different modes of transport and their wheels
- Look at similarities and differences
- Think about the function of wheels and where they fit on cars, carriages and bicycles.

## Suggested activities:

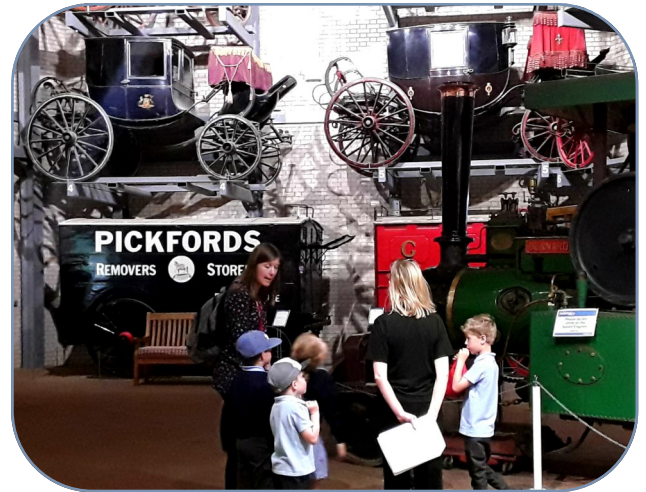
### After the visit
