Hat Factory Associates programme – 2024-25

The Culture Trust Luton is seeking applications for multiple Hat Factory Associates to support its new Artist Development and Public Engagement programme, delivering a diverse range of creative and cultural skills programmes working with other commissioned artists and engaging with the local community.

The associates will specifically be responding to the new 'Luton Matters' Public Artwork commissions and outputs and will be interlinked with the delivery of these commissions.





1. Introduction

The Culture Trust Luton is an independent arts and cultural charity that produces and presents year round programmes across our theatres, museums, art centre, gardens and historic hat factories. We welcome local and regional users across our venues and we invite the wider international community to engage with Luton, which is an incredibly diverse and stimulating town. We actively commission artists, public art and collaborate to produce and co-produce new work. We are currently engaging in a £10m capital programme to transform three old hat factories into vibrant creative workspaces in the Hat District. The Hat Factory Arts Centre is part of this network of creative and cultural spaces which will provide clear pathways for anyone with a skill, talent or passion for arts and culture to progress.

2. What is a Hat Factory Associate?

This opportunity is open to all creatives (with a connection to Luton) including makers, crafters, painters, poets, performers, designers, collectives, organisations and entrepreneurs.

As a Factory Associate, you will support the Trust to develop a programme of work which will reflect the diversity of the local area with reference to the Luton Matters Public Art commission being developed alongside, focused on Black Culture specifically through the lens of Fashion. The brief for this commission can be found <u>here</u>.

Based at the Hat Factory Arts Centre, in the heart of Luton's historic Hat District, Factory Associates will have access to a range of resources to support the development of their creative career.

The Associate programme is designed to give artists time to develop their own practice alongside curating and supporting initiatives directed by the Trust through the Luton Matters Producer. Factory associates will:

- Have space (if available) and time to develop their own practice and projects, working with the Trust to identify and harness broader career development opportunities, including securing a mentor and accessing funding.
- Receive support to deliver a creative and cultural skills/learning programme with engaging activities for local artists, creatives, young people and audiences. The programme of activities can include exhibitions, events, courses, workshops and/or performances.
- Have the opportunity to work in close collaboration with a commissioned artist(s) who will be commissioned to deliver a new major artwork in the public realm. (The creative and cultural skills programme will be inspired by the themes and fabrication of this piece).

Factory Associates will receive:





- The opportunity to work in making and rehearsal spaces at Hat Factory Arts Centre if available.
- Free co-working space at Hat Works, Luton's home for Creative Entrepreneurs if available.
- Supported from a dedicated Luton Producer to curate and deliver activities for the Luton Matters Programme.
- Potential creative and business development support from the Culture Trust.
- Support in identifying and connecting with a suitable mentor
- Networking opportunities with creative and Hat District tenants
- Fees of up to £4,500 for the development and delivery of the public skills/learning programme.
