Artist Study: Theodor Kern



For use in individual schools alongside loaned paintings

Session summary:

Pupils will study the portraits on loan by Theodor Kern closely, and use what they have learnt to recreate art styles and techniques in their own artwork.

Learning objectives:

Pupils will have the opportunity to:

- · To appreciate the particular styles of an individual artist
- To discover the different ways in which portraits can be created
- To think about the use of textures and colours in their artwork

- They will recognise the styles and compositions of Theodor Kern's portraits and be able to replicate certain elements of his work in their own art.
- Most children will also be able to create a self-portrait that showcases some of the skills they learn throughout the session.
