


# Pablo the Penguin

**Venue: Wardown House Museum (60 minutes)** 

## **Session summary:**

This session allows the children to consider the habitats of the Antarctic with creatures such as penguins and seals. The children will take part in our specially written story about Pablo the Penguin and interact with lots of different objects. They will be given an opportunity to think about themes such as habitat and the food chain.

To finish the session the children will have the opportunity to colour in a mask to take back to school.



## Learning objectives:

The pupils will have the opportunity to:

- · Work individually, in small groups and as a whole class.
- Consider the theme of identity.
- · Make a mask to take home.
- Listen to and participate in a story.

#### Suggested activities:


#### After the visit:
