Anglo Saxons – Discoveries KS2



Venue: Stockwood Discovery Centre (75 minutes)

Session summary:

The session focuses on Anglo-Saxon life and death by making use of a grave reconstruction displayed in the gallery. Using this display we will discuss what and how much Archaeologist can find out about the Anglo-Saxons from the evidence they find in graves. As part of the session we will need two volunteers to take part in an Anglo-Saxon burial so that the process and rituals can be discussed.

Assessment opportunities: During this session students' knowledge and understanding can be assessed through their verbal contributions and discussions can provide opportunity to assess personal development.



Learning objectives:


- Appreciate the significance of artefacts and graves to understanding the past and the role of archaeologists
- Interpret evidence though discussion and enquiry
- Consider what this area was like in the Saxon period
- Describe some of the rituals surrounding death and burials during the Anglo-Saxon period



Suggested activities:

Before the visit

Although this session can be used as an introduction to the Anglo-Saxons it is beneficial for the children to have some basic knowledge before they come. For example they should know a little bit about Anglo-Saxon life.

After the visit

Make a sketch of the Anglo-Saxon grave they have recreated at the museum and label the objects saying why they might have been placed in the grave.


Creative writing describing the life of the person (s) buried and their status.
