ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITIES

We are seeking an experienced, dedicated, and ambitious Curator to join our team and manage our significant Hat Industry and Headwear collection. We have been collecting hats and hat industry materials since the museum opened in 1927. The collection celebrates Luton as the centre of English hat making and documents its international connections through this trade.

This role will work with the Head of Heritage and Collections and the Creative Director to develop and deliver world-class Hat Industry and Headwear programmes and exhibitions, support new projects and initiatives that promote and develop the collection.

The new Curator will support the Trust to develop study and research programmes that will develop that Hat Research Centre at Wardown House Museum and Gallery, and promote the Hat collection nationally and internationally. The postholder will have a key role in making the collection more accessible to milliners, students, researchers, artists and those interested in fashion, culture, technology or industry.

In this new dynamic role, the Curator will undertake the administration of their projects, including budgets and the coordination and of project staff and volunteers. They will be primarily based at Wardown House Museum and Gallery, with opportunities to work across all Culture Trust sites.

■ The key responsibilities are:

- To work toward achieving designation for our nationally significant Hat Industry & Headwear collection.
- Explore the potential of the stored collections to ensure their relevance to communities, and for exhibitions and future research.
- To develop and manage programmes of contemporary collecting from the communities of Luton.

Facilitate public access to the collections through visits, enquiries by letter, telephone and email.

- Manage the care, storage, development and interpretation of the Museum's Collection including their conservation, documentation, publication, display and loans in accordance with museum policy.
- Provide an identification service for areas of curatorial responsibility.
- Develop and deliver study days, workshops, presentations, talks, events, outreach activities and publications on collection themes and professional issues to specialist and non-specialist groups.
- Take an active role in the Curatorial Team to support the Head of Heritage and Collections in making decisions and collective judgements about curatorial issues.
- Contribute to the development and implementation of curatorial policies and strategy documents including forward planning processes.
- Lead and support projects across the Trust including the development and installation of permanent and temporary gallery displays based on the needs of the local communities and ensuring access in its broadest sense.
- Supervise and support museum makers, volunteers, work experience students and apprentices as required.
- Provide specialist advice and assistance to museums staff, other departments of Culture Trust and external bodies.
- Promote and represent the Museum and give support and curatorial advice to colleagues in the wider museums community.

- Ability to prepare and give talks, presentations, and outreach activities to a wide variety of audiences
